2009 The Brief Wondrous Life of Oscar Wao by Junot Diaz

Oscar Cabral is an overweight "ghetto nerd" who dreams of becoming the Dominican J. R. R. Tolkien. This rich work encompasses the heartbreaking and tragic story of Oscar's mother, Beli, from her youth in Santo Domingo in the 1940-50's during a brutal regime to adulthood living in New Jersey.

2008 The Plot Against America by Philip Roth What if Charles Lindberg, national hero, described as a "rabid isolationist, Nazi sympathizer and crypto-fascist" was elected president in the 1940 election instead of FDR?

2007 Their Eyes Were Watching God by Zora Neale Hurston

A novel set in the 1920s, where free-spirited Janie Crawford's search for happiness leads her through several different marriages, challenging the mores of her small town.

2006 The Ditchdigger's Daughters by Yvonne S. Thornton

Donald Thornton, a ditchdigger in Fort Monmouth, NJ, has the perfect comeback for all the people that tease him about having five daughters and no sons: "You won't be laughin' when my little girls grow up to be doctors."

**2005** *To Kill a Mockingbird* by Harper Lee The conscience of a small Southern town seeped in prejudice and hypocrisy is rocked when Atticus Finch defends a black man accused of raping a white young woman.

2004 The Pine Barrens by John McPhee Although New Jersey has the heaviest population density of any state, huge segments of the Pine Barrens remain uninhabited, and the few who dwell in the region are little known and often misunderstood.

# Young Adult Winners

2009 Life As We Knew It by Susan Beth Pfeffer When an asteroid hits the moon, it causes a change in the moon's orbit and unleashes a series of world-wide disasters, and 16-year-old Miranda's whole life changes.

2008 Dr. Franklin's Island by Ann Halam For three teens, a trip-of-a-lifetime quickly becomes a fight for survival as they find themselves on a remote island, which happens to be the home of a mad scientist, anxious for experimental subjects.

2007 So Yesterday by Scott Westerfeld It's Hunter's job to keep ahead of the latest trends and tell the world exactly what these trends are. Jennifer is a free, original thinker, what Hunter calls an Innovator, but original thoughts can be dangerous.

2006 Swallowing Stones by Joyce McDonald Dual perspectives reveal the aftermath of seventeen-year-old Michael's birthday celebration during which he discharges an antique Winchester rifle and unknowingly kills the father of high school classmate Jenna.

2005 Dunk by David Lubar While hoping to work as the clown in a dunk tank on the boardwalk of the NJ shore, Chad faces his best friend's serious illness, hassles with police, and the girl that got away.

2004 The Body of Christopher Creed by Carol Plum-Ucci Torey Adams, a high school junior with a seemingly perfect life, struggles with doubts and questions surrounding the mysterious disappearance of the class outcast.

### Middle Grade Winners

2009 *Marley: A Dog Like No Other* by John Grogan When newlyweds John and his wife Jenny decide they want to adopt a puppy, they find a bargain Labrador Retriever, and so Marley enters their lives.

2008 The Sisters Grimm: The Fairy Tale Detectives by Michael Buckley

As descendents of Wilhelm, the Grimm family must keep the fairy tale characters, the "Everafters," contained. When Granny Relda goes missing, it is up to Sabrina and Daphne to solve the mystery, which involves giants, pixies, fairies and witches.

2007 Whales on Stilts! by M. T. Anderson When Lily's father refuses to believe that she overheard his boss, a mad scientist, claim that he wants to take over the world, she enlists the help of her best friends, and together they race to save the world from the mad scientist's army of whales.

2006 Amber Brown is Not a Crayon by Paula Danziger Third-grader Amber Brown has just received some bad news: her best friend Justin is moving away. When Justin doesn't want to talk about how he feels, she's sure it's the end of their friendship.

2005 The Hoboken Chicken Emergency
 by Daniel Pinkwater
 When Arthur Bobowicz is sent out to bring home
 the family's Thanksgiving turkey, he returns instead
 with a 266-pound chicken named Henrietta.

2004 Because of Winn-Dixie by Kate DiCamillo Ten-year-old India Opal Buloni describes her first summer in the town of Naomi, Florida, and all the good things that happen to her because of her big ugly dog Winn-Dixie.

### Read to Me Winners

2009 Art written and illustrated by Patrick McDonnell

A young boy named Art has a passion for art, of course. He paints, he splotches, he draws, he squiggles, and he creates with abandon and verve.

2008 Anansi and the Moss-Covered Rock retold by Eric A. Kimmel, illustrated by Janet Stevens When Anansi discovers a magical rock that puts animals to sleep, he decides to use the stone's magic to trick the other animals out of their food supplies.

2007 Bear Snores On by Karma Wilson; illustrated by Jane Chapman

A bear is snuggled in his lair for a long winter's sleep while a mouse, a hare, and others join in for a social gathering. Everyone is perfectly happy being shielded from the elements until the bear wakes up, Grumbling and grouchy because he is missing out on all the fun.

2006 Wild About Books by Judy Sierra; illustrated by Marc Brown

Computer savvy "Springfield Librarian, Molly McGrew by mistake drove her bookmobile into the Zoo." Taking advantage of the situation, the librarian offers each animal the appropriate book.

2005 Piggie Pie by Margie Palatini; illustrated by Howard Fine

Gritch the Witch (with her traditional pointy hat, broomstick and green fingernails) is all set for a delicious meal of piggie pie. But when she lands at MacDonald's farm she can't find a single pig.

2004 How the Cat Swallowed Thunder by Lloyd Alexander; illustrated by Judith Byron Schachner

Warned not to get into his usual mischief, Mother Holly's cat tries to tidy up all the mess he has made while she is away.
